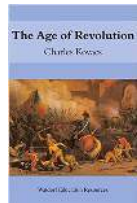
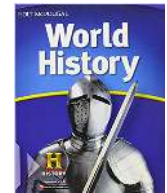

We will cover the last three units in this text, but will use the earlier chapters in the first world history course.



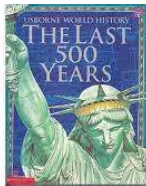
